Fall Reunion 2013

The Shawnee Lodge will hold the Fall Reunion September 6-8 at the S bar F Scout Ranch. Our Reunion is one of the nation's largest (and greatest!) O.A. events. Join us for a great weekend of fun, service, and fellowship! Inside The Lookout, find the parking plan, trading post hours, and other relevant information on the Reunion. Remember each youth member *must* have in unit adult supervision to participate. All Arrowmen must provide his or her *own* equipment and meals, with the exception of Saturday dinner if purchased.

The price of Saturday dinner and patch is \$14.00, if paid before August 24^{th} , and \$17.00 thereafter, and \$20 at the event. The patch by itself is \$10.00, unless purchased after August 24^{th} , in which case it is \$12.00, and \$15 at the event. Both tickets include the ice cream social on Saturday evening. Tickets may be purchased at the Council offices or via our Online Registration available at www.shawneelodge.org. Tickets purchased online will not be mailed. All candidates must have a red colored candidate ticket to participate in the Ordeal activities.



The emblem for the Reunion is only available for those who purchase a ticket for the event. Since our Lodge does not collect dues, our Lodge relies on paying participants at Lodge events. There are only a limited number of emblems available, so purchase your tickets in advance! Enclosed is a return envelope for making your reservations. The numbers of tickets sold will *not* exceed the number of emblems. Make your reservations quickly, as the event has sold out in past vears; meals and emblems are limited.

For members who have purchased either ticket, we will have the shooting sports activities and a branding station from Noon to 3:00 PM. on Saturday. Fall Reunion: Rules and Regulations

The Lodge will enforce the following rules to insure that all Brothers and Candidates have a safe and enjoyable weekend. Your cooperation is absolutely essential to keeping the weekend emergency-free.

- **Do not** arrive before 4:00 p.m. The gates will be locked; you will not be able to enter. In the past, those arriving early have created problems in the layout of the campsites and chapter area headquarters. While this is a youth run 1. event, it is not necessary—or desired—that a Scout leave school early.
- Thanks to past service projects by chapters, the east side of the main asphalt road will be open to head-in parking. The road can be rough, be cautious! Signs will be posted on the west side of this road prohibiting stopping or parking. 2. We would like to keep this road open for two-way traffic.
- No parallel parking on or next to the main road.
- Please make use of the expanded areas of the camporee field west of the power cut for camping and parking.

- The power cut road is open for one-way traffic only. Head-in parking is allowed on both sides.

 Do not drive on the camporee field. Nobody wants to sleep in your tire ruts.

 No traffic will be allowed from 7:00 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. on Saturday night! The roads will be closed at Rand after 7:00 p.m. If you need to leave, move your car to the designated area past the Rand Building prior to 7:00 p.m.
- No individuals are allowed in the back of trucks.
- The S bar F Ranch speed limit is 20 M.P.H. Due to the large number of people in camp, please drive at a slower speed and use caution when driving on the roads near the camporee area. Slow down on gravel roads. "One Scout's life is worth your time, please slow down." The speed limit will be strictly enforced.

Fall Reunion: Service Projects

Each Chapter will be conducting a service project at an assigned location around the ranch during the day on Saturday. The project is always a fun time to enjoy earnest work surrounded by close friends and even new ones!

All Brothers are asked to bring the following equipment: work gloves, hand weed-whips, bow saws, strong garden or gravel rakes, and lots of water. Please contact your Chapter Officers for more information about your specific project. Adults may be asked to bring chain saws and gas weed-whips. Proper protection is required with weed-whips and saws!

Remember, to use a chainsaw an Order member must be at least 21 years old. To use a motorized weed-whip the member must be at least 18 years old. Proper protection must be worn at all times while operating power equipment.



A Note for Ceremonialists:

Please remember that a short-term camping reservation must be made with the Council's Camping Department when individuals or a unit plans to visit, camp, or conduct an activity on Council property. This includes wanting to look over a ceremonial site.

If you go to a Council property without completing a reservation with the Camping Service, the Camp Ranger will ask you to leave. Reservations are important for the safety of the individuals on property and the Camp Rangers. Your cooperation with this long-standing Council policy is expected.

Get Connected

Yearly Registration: signing up with the Lodge annually automatically puts you on a mailing list so that you can keep receiving the Lookout, postcards about upcoming Chapter Meetings, and other important Shawnee Lodge material. Unlike both Ordeal and Brotherhood, there is no set of requirements for you to meet. Rather, you are nominated by your peers in the Order.
