National Youth Leadership Training - NYLT



Have you ever been elected to a leadership position, but weren't exactly sure HOW to lead your group? Do you want to learn how to be a great leader? Then a week this summer at National Youth Leader Training (NYLT) is the place for you!

NYLT is a week-long training course that teaches you the how to be an effective leader while following the Scout Oath and Law. It takes place at Camp Sakima in our very own S bar F Scout Ranch. Go for a week filled with fun games, songs, and challenges that will better you as a leader.

For those seeking a greater challenge while still learning the NYLT leadership skills, there is the Pack N' Paddle program. This program takes place on and around Nims Lake and in the backcountry of the Ranch, allowing Scouts who attend to not only develop leadership skills, but will also practice low-impact camping, how to use a compass, how to backpack, and canoeing skills.

Venturers can join in the fun, too! There is an NYLT week specifically for Venturers who wish to take the course. All Venturers must meet the same requirements as the Pack N' Paddle course.

Though the OA is, at its heart, a service program based on our three principles, it is also a program that seeks the development of youth leaders. If you look at the new Lodge Officers and Chairmen, you will find that many of them have attended and staff NYLT. For this reason, we encourage you to attend this excellent training course.

I Found the Arrow at the High Adventure Bases!

Ready for the adventure of a lifetime? Want more of Philmont? If so, OA trail crew is just for you. Under the direction of the Philmont Conservation Department, participants spend one week building trails in Philmont's back country and another hiking a custom trek.

Trail Building is tough, but rewarding. The worksite experience is full of long, strenuous days requiring much physical effort. On top of the normal height, weight, and age requirements for Philmont, participants are expected to lift loads of up to 50 lbs. However, the experience is very rewarding, as the trails you will help build will last over 75 years and will be enjoyed by thousands of scouts from across the country.



Participants will also strengthen leadership skills, learn advanced wilderness and low-impact camping techniques, observe and participate in group wilderness safety, good judgment, and motivation, and receive special OA instruction. The project's mission is to maintain, reinforce, and enhance the purposes of the Order of the Arrow through scout camping traditions.

This two week program is **only \$250**, which is much less than a normal Philmont trek. Travel expenses are not included in this price.

You can apply by completing the application form at http://adventure.oa-bsa.org/oatc_app.pdf and mailing it with a \$50 deposit to Order of the Arrow, Boy Scouts of America, P.O. Box 152079, Irving, TX 75015-2079. Applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis, and the deposit will be returned if you are not accepted.

The Vigil Honor

The Vigil Honor is the highest honor that the Order of the Arrow can present to its members for service to the Lodge and the Council's camping program. It dates to the year 1915, when the Order's founder, E. Urner Goodman, became the first Vigil Honor member. Since then, thousands of members have been awarded this honor.

It is a high mark of distinction and recognition reserved for those Arrowmen who have given exceptional service, helping others beyond the call of duty, involving personal effort and unselfish interest to one or more of the following: their Lodge, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting, or their Scout camp. Under no circumstances should tenure in Scouting or the Order of the Arrow be considered as reason enough for a Vigil Honor recommendation.

Alertness to the needs of others is the mark of the Vigil Honor. This calls for an unusual awareness of the possibilities within each situation.

Vigil Honor members have an honorable tradition to uphold. They must at all times conduct themselves in accordance with the ideals of Scouting, the Order of the Arrow, and the Vigil Honor. Membership cannot be won by a person's conscious endeavor. It comes as recognition of his unselfish service. This fact should be given careful consideration in the selection of candidates for membership. The Vigil Honor has successfully fulfilled a very definite and satisfactory service to the Order of the Arrow, to Scouting, and to individual members. Its continued success depends on the care with which future members are selected and on the maintenance by its members of the high ideals of service to others for which the Vigil Honor has always been known. Vigil nominations must be turned in to the Council office by November 15th. The nomination form is available on the Lodge website at http://www.ShawneeLodge.org/files/vigil_nomination_fillable.pdf. Nominate someone worthy!

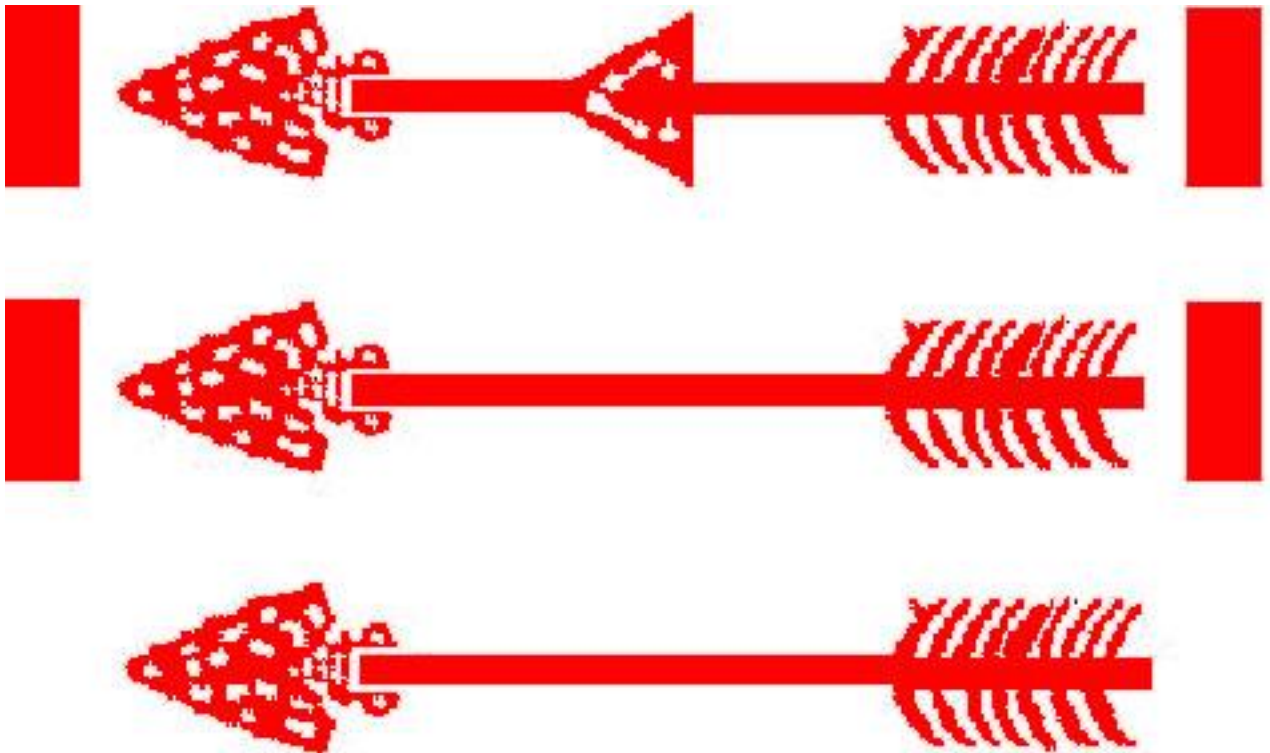
