A NOTE FROM OUR CHIEF

My Brothers,

It has been both a privilege and an honor to serve you as your Lodge Chief for a second term. The 2009-2010 lodge administration has continued upon the progress that was begun last year. The *Quality Chapter Award* has been cemented and is now a core program of the lodge that gives chapters a vision of what an ideal chapter is and encourages each chapter to perform to their highest potential. The lodge has fundamentally changed our camp promotion program based upon the success of Boone Trail's Cub Scout Promotion Pilot Program, headed by Boone Trail Chief Connor Lalonde and Boone Trail Camp Promotion Chairman Stuart Krull. Whereas camp promotions in the past were given to Boy Scout troops, now promotions are given exclusively to cub packs where the promotions have a much greater chance of being effective. And, after much review of the Brotherhood Surveys from the 2008 Winter Fellowship Banquet, the lodge has decided to personalize Brotherhood questioning by making it a responsibility of the chapters instead of the lodge.

Besides refining and improving projects started in 2008-2009, the Lodge Executive Committee has been busy refining our lodge's bylaws and launching new programs. Beginning in October, the lodge began to reexamine the bylaws' wording regarding when the sash is allowed to be worn. At the November Lodge Executive Committee (LEC) meeting, a full debate ensued regarding this issue, and two new amendments were adopted at the January LEC with overwhelming support which allow for the sash to be worn more frequently (*See the last page for amendment details*). The 2009 Winter Fellowship Banquet boasted record attendance and saw our brothers provide overwhelming support to our lodge's first annual Toys for Tots collection. Furthermore, at the banquet, the lodge unveiled the 100th Anniversary Commemorative Pocket Flap Program which challenges brothers to not only be active in their troops and chapters, but to also be active members of their communities.

The Lodge Executive Committee has been working hard to improve your experience as a member of the Shawnee Lodge. You can count on us to continue to do so as we prepare for Ceremonial Team Seminar, the One Day of Service, Spring Conclave, and Section Conclave. Peruse the rest of the Lookout to get details on these exciting upcoming events.

I will conclude with this simple truth: our lodge can only be as strong as our members. Thus, I challenge you to become more active in our great Order.



Are you looking for something beyond the usual summer camp? You should think about participating in the Ranger Program, Nagel Horse Camp, or River Ranger Program. Check out these great opportunities to go camping and participate in exciting activities.

Horse Camp

Horse Camp will be at Beaumont Scout Reservation at the Nagel Base from June 6 to June 12, 2010. This 7-day adventure includes more than just horseback riding. River Ranger Program

The River Ranger Program is designed for those Scouts who are 14 or older, or in their fourth summer camp, are in good physical condition and are looking for adventure on a weeklong float trip. Cooperation, teamwork, and leadership development are key parts of the River Ranger Program. A minimum of 20 Scouts is needed to conduct the program. The River Ranger Program takes place on the Eleven Point River in south central Missouri. Individual Scouts may sign up for the River Ranger Program as their second week in camp. A cost of \$235.00 will be charged for the River Ranger Program, which includes meals, program materials, canoe rental from private outfitter, transportation to and from the S bar F Scout Ranch, and Ranger Program patch. Adults are welcome on the program. The River Ranger program is June 6-11. Scouts should meet at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday at the Scout Lodge in the S bar F Camporee Area. I will always regard the ties of brotherhood in the Order of the Arrow, as lasting, and will seek to preserve a cheerful spirit even in the midst of irksome tasks and weighty responsibilities, and will endeavor, so far as in my power lies to be unselfish in service and devotion to the welfare of others.

EXTENDED ELANGOMAT PROGRAM

Have you experienced the Extended Elangomat Program? The program will use the Elangomat to ensure that the candidate is given guidance throughout his first year as an Order of the Arrow member. The Elangomat will be expected to keep in contact with the new Ordeal member, encourage his attendance at chapter functions, and assist the new Ordeal member with earning the Brotherhood Honor. The two-part patch that has been designed for the Extended Elangomat Program as well as additional information about the program can be found on the Shawnee Lodge Web site.

Brotherhood questioning occurs on the Saturday afternoon of the Spring Conclave at your chapter headquarters. The fee is \$15.

CHANGES IN THE SHAWNEE LODGE BY-LAWS

During the January LEC, the LEC members voted to amend the Shawnee Lodge By-Laws. Everyone in the lodge is affected by these changes, so please make sure that the other OA members in your troop know about these changes. The following sections of the Shawnee Lodge By-Laws have been amended as follows (changes have been marked in **bold**):

Section II. G. Uniforming

1. All candidates and brothers participating in **a ceremony** of this Lodge shall wear a complete and official Scout, Venturer, Explorer, or Scouter uniform. Candidates not in full uniform are to be **presented with the sash over their right shoulder in the ceremony and then asked in private after the ceremony to remove it with an explanation as to why.** 2. The sash is only worn in complete and full uniform, and over the right shoulder of the complete and full uniform as described in the current printing of the Boy Scout/Varsity Scout Uniform Inspection Sheet, or equivalent pieces of the Venturer or Explorer uniform, with headgear optional (Headgear is any type of a Scouting hat).

3. Sashes are to be worn at Order of the Arrow functions. In addition sashes may be worn at special public events - troop courts of honors, district roundtables, community parades, public flag ceremonies, etc. - when representing Scouting and/or the Order of the Arrow. The sash is not to be worn for unit fund raising activities. Sashes are not to become a routine part of the Scout uniform.
