


Are you looking for something beyond the usual summer camp? Check out these great opportunities to go camping and participate in exciting activities! RANGER PROGRAM

Do you go with your troop to summer camp every year and yearn for something new? The Ranger Program is calling your name. You'll spend Sunday night with your troop, but on Monday morning, you'll take off and spend the week exploring the "other side" of the Ranch. Rangers spend their days roaming the backcountry, hiking every corner of the Ranch with some awesome experiences on the way: try out a sweat lodge, shoot black powder rifles, or blacksmith at an actual forge. New for 2012: Wilderness Survival, Archeology, and Pulp & Paper merit badges will be offered.

HORSE CAMP

If you think all you'll do here is ride horses, you're dead wrong, because you do so much more than that. Sure, you get to ride horses—a lot—but you also get to swim, shoot shotguns, and even rappel from cliffs! The week even ends with a real horse show for you to show your stuff!

OLDER SCOUT SWIFT BASE

Swift Base features a totally different summer camp experience! Each summer, certain weeks are set aside for special venturing and older scout programs. This year features 3 special week:

June 17-23 - Aquatics Week/Sea Scout Emphasis June 24-30 - Climbing/Land Navigation/Astronomy Emphasis

July 8-14 - Shooting Sports/Wilderness Survival/Living History Emphasis

NATIONAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP TRAINING

This week-long course is aimed at honing you into a mean, green, leading machine. Like Lord Baden-Powell said, "The Spirit is there in every boy; it has to be discovered and brought to light." NYLT seeks to teach you how to be a leader. The week utilizes the patrol method to teach how to lead yourself and, ultimately, how to lead others. As any NYLT graduate knows, "If you can see it, you can be it."

PACK AND PADDLE

Not for the weak at heart! Pack and Paddle builds on the NYLT course by incorporating hiking through the backcountry and canoeing on the beautiful Nims Lake. Pack and Paddle even gets to stop at Huck's Cove, camp in the tree houses, and hike to Castle Rock. If extreme is your middle name, Pack and Paddle wants *you*.

EXTENDED ELANGOMAT PROGRAM

This program uses the Elangomat to give candidates guidance throughout his first year in the Order of the Arrow. The Elangomat will be expected to keep in contact with the new Ordeal member, encourage him to attend Order of the Arrow functions, and assist him with earning the Brotherhood Honor.
